On the Univalence Criterion of a General Integral Operator

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In this paper we considered an general integral operator and three classes of univalent functions for which the second order derivative is equal to zero. By imposing supplementary conditions for these functions we proved some univalent conditions for the considered general operator. Also some interesting particular results are presented.

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1. Introduction

Let unit disk and let \mathcal{A} denote the class of functions f of the form

$$f(z) = z + a_2z^2 + a_3z^3 + \dots \quad (z \in \mathcal{U}), \quad (1.1)$$

which are analytic in the open disk \mathcal{U} and satisfy the conditions $f(0) = f'(0) - 1 = 0$. Consider $\mathcal{S} = \{f \in \mathcal{A} : f \text{ are univalent functions in } \mathcal{U}\}$.

Let \mathcal{A}_2 be the subclass of \mathcal{A} consisting of functions of the form

$$f(z) = z + \sum_{k=3}^{\infty} a_k z^k. \quad (1.2)$$

Let \mathcal{T} be the univalent subclass of \mathcal{A} which satisfies

$$\left| \frac{z^2 f'(z)}{(f(z))^2} - 1 \right| < 1 \quad (z \in \mathcal{U}). \quad (1.3)$$

Let \mathcal{T}_2 be the subclass of \mathcal{T} for which $f''(0) = 0$. Let $\mathcal{T}_{2,\mu}$ be the subclass of \mathcal{T}_2 consisting of functions of the form (1.2) which satisfy

$$\left| \frac{z^2 f'(z)}{(f(z))^2} - 1 \right| \leq \mu \quad (z \in \mathcal{U}) \quad (1.4)$$

for some μ ($0 < \mu \leq 1$), and let us denote $\mathcal{T}_{2,1} \equiv \mathcal{T}_2$. Furthermore, for some real p with $0 < p \leq 2$ we define a subclass $\mathcal{S}(p)$ of \mathcal{A} consisting of all functions $f(z)$ which satisfy

$$\left| \left(\frac{z}{f(z)} \right)'' \right| \leq p \quad (z \in \mathcal{U}). \quad (1.5)$$

In [1], Singh has shown that if $f(z) \in \mathcal{S}(p)$, then $f(z)$ satisfies

$$\left| \frac{z^2 f'(z)}{(f(z))^2} - 1 \right| \leq p|z|^2 \quad (z \in \mathcal{U}). \quad (1.6)$$

Ahlfors [2] and Becker [3] had obtained the following univalence criterion.

Theorem 1.1. *Let c be a complex number, $|c| \leq 1$, $c \neq -1$. If $f(z) = z + a_2 z^2 + \dots$ is a regular function in \mathcal{U} and*

$$\left| c|z|^2 + (1 - |z|^2) \frac{z f''(z)}{f'(z)} \right| \leq 1 \quad (1.7)$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the function f is regular and univalent in \mathcal{U} .

In [4], Pescar had obtained the following theorem.

Theorem 1.2 (see [4]). *Let β be a complex number, $\operatorname{Re} \beta > 0$, c a complex number, $|c| \leq 1$, $c \neq -1$, and $h(z) = z + a_2 z^2 + \dots$ a regular function in \mathcal{U} . If*

$$\left| c|z|^{2\beta} + (1 - |z|^{2\beta}) \frac{z h''(z)}{\beta h'(z)} \right| \leq 1 \quad (1.8)$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the function

$$F_\beta(z) = \left[\beta \int_0^z t^{\beta-1} h'(t) dt \right]^{1/\beta} = z + \dots \quad (1.9)$$

is regular and univalent in \mathcal{U} .

Lemma 1.3 (the general Schwarz lemma [5]). *Let the function $f(z)$ be regular in the disk $\mathcal{U}_R = \{z \in \mathbb{C}; |z| < R\}$, with $|f(z)| < M$ for fixed M . If $f(z)$ has one zero with multiplicity order bigger than m for $z = 0$, then*

$$|f(z)| \leq \frac{M}{R^m} |z|^m, \quad z \in \mathcal{U}_R. \quad (1.10)$$

The equality can hold only if $f(z) = e^{i\theta} (M/R^m) z^m$, where θ is constant.

In [6], Seenivasagan and Breaz consider for $f_i \in \mathcal{A}_2$ ($i = 1, 2, \dots, n$) and $\alpha_1, \alpha_2, \dots, \alpha_n, \beta \in \mathbb{C}$, the integral operator

$$F_{\alpha_1, \alpha_2, \dots, \alpha_n, \beta}(z) = \left\{ \beta \int_0^z t^{\beta-1} \prod_{i=1}^n \left(\frac{f_i(t)}{t} \right)^{1/\alpha_i} dt \right\}^{1/\beta}. \quad (1.11)$$

When $\alpha_i = \alpha$ for all $i = 1, 2, \dots, n$, $F_{\alpha_1, \alpha_2, \dots, \alpha_n, \beta}(z)$ becomes the integral operator $F_{\alpha, \beta}(z)$ considered in [7].

2. Main results

Theorem 2.1. *Let $M \geq 1$, let the functions $f_i \in \mathcal{S}(p)$, for $i \in \{1, \dots, n\}$, satisfy the condition (1.6), let α_i, β be complex numbers, let $\mathbf{Re} \beta \geq \sum_{i=1}^n ((1+p)M + 1)/|\alpha_i|$, and let c be a complex number.*

If

$$|c| \leq 1 - \frac{1}{\mathbf{Re} \beta} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{(1+p)M + 1}{|\alpha_i|}, \quad (2.1)$$

$$|f_i(z)| \leq M,$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the functions $F_{\alpha_1, \alpha_2, \dots, \alpha_n, \beta}$ defined in (1.11) are in the class \mathcal{S} .

Proof. Define a function

$$h(z) = \int_0^z \prod_{i=1}^n \left(\frac{f_i(t)}{t} \right)^{1/\alpha_i} dt, \quad (2.2)$$

then we have $h(0) = h'(0) - 1 = 0$. Also, a simple computation yields

$$h'(z) = \prod_{i=1}^n \left(\frac{f_i(z)}{z} \right)^{1/\alpha_i}, \quad (2.3)$$

$$\frac{zh''(z)}{h'(z)} = \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{\alpha_i} \left(\frac{zf'_i(z)}{f_i(z)} - 1 \right).$$

From (2.3), we have

$$\left| \frac{zh''(z)}{h'(z)} \right| \leq \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} \left(\left| \frac{zf'_i(z)}{f_i(z)} \right| + 1 \right) = \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} \left(\left| \frac{z^2 f'_i(z)}{f_i^2(z)} \right| \left| \frac{f_i(z)}{z} \right| + 1 \right). \quad (2.4)$$

From the hypothesis, we have $|f_i(z)| \leq M$ ($z \in \mathcal{U}, i = 1, 2, \dots, n$), then by the general Schwarz lemma, we obtain that

$$|f_i(z)| \leq M|z| \quad (z \in \mathcal{U}, i = 1, 2, \dots, n). \quad (2.5)$$

We apply this result in inequality (2.4), then we obtain

$$\begin{aligned}
 \left| \frac{zh''(z)}{h'(z)} \right| &\leq \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} \left(\left| \frac{z^2 f'_i(z)}{(f_i(z))^2} \right| M + 1 \right) \\
 &\leq \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} \left(\left| \frac{z^2 f'_i(z)}{(f_i(z))^2} - 1 \right| M + M + 1 \right) \\
 &= \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} (pM|z|^2 + M + 1) \\
 &< \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{(1+p)M + 1}{|\alpha_i|}.
 \end{aligned} \tag{2.6}$$

We have

$$\begin{aligned}
 \left| c|z|^{2\beta} + (1 - |z|^{2\beta}) \frac{zh''(z)}{\beta h'(z)} \right| &= \left| c|z|^{2\beta} + (1 - |z|^{2\beta}) \frac{1}{\beta} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{\alpha_i} \left(\frac{zf'_i(z)}{f_i(z)} - 1 \right) \right| \\
 &\leq |c| + \frac{1}{|\beta|} \cdot \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} \left(\left| \frac{z^2 f'_i(z)}{f_i^2(z)} \right| \cdot \frac{|f_i(z)|}{|z|} + 1 \right).
 \end{aligned} \tag{2.7}$$

We obtain

$$\begin{aligned}
 \left| c|z|^{2\beta} + (1 - |z|^{2\beta}) \frac{zh''(z)}{\beta h'(z)} \right| &< |c| + \frac{1}{|\beta|} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{(1+p)M + 1}{|\alpha_i|} \\
 &\leq |c| + \frac{1}{\mathbf{Re} \beta} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{(1+p)M + 1}{|\alpha_i|}.
 \end{aligned} \tag{2.8}$$

So, from (2.1) we have

$$\left| c|z|^{2\beta} + (1 - |z|^{2\beta}) \frac{zh''(z)}{\beta h'(z)} \right| \leq 1. \tag{2.9}$$

Applying Theorem 1.2, we obtain that $F_{\alpha_1, \alpha_2, \dots, \alpha_n, \beta}$ is univalent. \square

Theorem 2.2. Let $M \geq 1$, let the functions $f_i \in \mathcal{S}(p)$, for $i \in \{1, \dots, n\}$, satisfy the condition (1.6), let α, β be complex numbers, let $\mathbf{Re} \beta \geq n((1+p)M + 1)/|\alpha|$, and let c be a complex number.

If

$$\begin{aligned}
 |c| &\leq 1 - \frac{1}{\mathbf{Re} \beta} \frac{n((p+1)M + 1)}{|\alpha|}, \\
 |f_i(z)| &\leq M,
 \end{aligned} \tag{2.10}$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the function

$$F_{\alpha, \beta}(z) = \left\{ \beta \int_0^z t^{\beta-1} \prod_{i=1}^n \left(\frac{f_i(t)}{t} \right)^{1/\alpha} dt \right\}^{1/\beta} \tag{2.11}$$

is in the class \mathcal{S} .

Proof. In Theorem 2.1, we consider $\alpha_1 = \alpha_2 = \dots = \alpha_n = \alpha$. \square

Corollary 2.3. *Let the functions $f_i \in \mathcal{S}(p)$, for $i \in \{1, \dots, n\}$, satisfy the condition (1.6), let α_i, β be complex numbers, let $\operatorname{Re} \beta \geq \sum_{i=1}^n ((p+2)/|\alpha_i|)$, and let c be a complex number.*

If

$$|c| \leq 1 - \frac{1}{\operatorname{Re} \beta} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{p+2}{|\alpha_i|}, \quad (2.12)$$

$$|f_i(z)| \leq 1,$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the function $F_{\alpha_1, \alpha_2, \dots, \alpha_n, \beta}$ defined in (1.11) is in the class \mathcal{S} .

Proof. In Theorem 2.1, we consider $M = 1$. \square

Corollary 2.4. *Let $M \geq 1$, let the function $f \in \mathcal{S}(p)$ satisfy the condition (1.6), let α, β be complex numbers, let $\operatorname{Re} \beta \geq ((1+p)M+1)/|\alpha|$, and let c be a complex number.*

If

$$|c| \leq 1 - \frac{1}{\operatorname{Re} \beta} \frac{(1+p)M+1}{|\alpha|}, \quad (2.13)$$

$$|f(z)| \leq M$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the function

$$G_{\alpha, \beta}(z) = \left\{ \beta \int_0^z t^{\beta-1} \left(\frac{f(t)}{t} \right)^{1/\alpha} dt \right\}^{1/\beta} \quad (2.14)$$

is in the class \mathcal{S} .

Proof. In Theorem 2.1, we consider $n = 1$. \square

Corollary 2.5. *Let the function $f \in \mathcal{S}(p)$ satisfy the condition (1.6), let α, β be complex numbers, let $\operatorname{Re} \beta \geq (p+2)/|\alpha|$, and let c be a complex number.*

If

$$|c| \leq 1 - \frac{1}{\operatorname{Re} \beta} \frac{p+2}{|\alpha|}, \quad (2.15)$$

$$|f(z)| \leq 1$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the function

$$G_{\alpha, \beta}(z) = \left\{ \beta \int_0^z t^{\beta-1} \left(\frac{f(t)}{t} \right)^{1/\alpha} dt \right\}^{1/\beta} \quad (2.16)$$

is in the class \mathcal{S} .

Proof. In Corollary 2.4, we consider $M = 1$. \square

Theorem 2.6. Let $M \geq 1$, let the functions $f_i \in \mathcal{T}_{2,\mu_i}$, for $i \in \{1, \dots, n\}$, satisfy the condition (1.4), let α_i, β be complex numbers, let $\operatorname{Re} \beta \geq \sum_{i=1}^n ((1 + \mu_i)M + 1)/|\alpha_i|$, and let c be a complex number.

If

$$|c| \leq 1 - \frac{1}{\operatorname{Re} \beta} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{(1 + \mu_i)M + 1}{|\alpha_i|}, \quad (2.17)$$

$$|f_i(z)| \leq M$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the function $F_{\alpha_1, \alpha_2, \dots, \alpha_n, \beta}$ defined in (1.11) is in the class \mathcal{S} .

Proof. Define a function

$$h(z) = \int_0^z \prod_{i=1}^n \left(\frac{f_i(t)}{t} \right)^{1/\alpha_i} dt, \quad (2.18)$$

then we have $h(0) = h'(0) - 1 = 0$. Also a simple computation yields

$$h'(z) = \prod_{i=1}^n \left(\frac{f_i(z)}{z} \right)^{1/\alpha_i}, \quad (2.19)$$

$$\frac{zh''(z)}{h'(z)} = \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{\alpha_i} \left(\frac{zf'_i(z)}{f_i(z)} - 1 \right).$$

From (2.19), we have

$$\left| \frac{zh''(z)}{h'(z)} \right| \leq \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} \left(\left| \frac{zf'_i(z)}{f_i(z)} \right| + 1 \right) = \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} \left(\left| \frac{z^2 f'_i(z)}{f_i^2(z)} \right| \left| \frac{f_i(z)}{z} \right| + 1 \right). \quad (2.20)$$

From the hypothesis, we have $|f_i(z)| \leq M$ ($z \in \mathcal{U}, i = 1, 2, \dots, n$), then by the general Schwarz lemma, we obtain that

$$|f_i(z)| \leq M|z| \quad (z \in \mathcal{U}, i = 1, 2, \dots, n). \quad (2.21)$$

From (2.20), we obtain

$$\begin{aligned} \left| \frac{zh''(z)}{h'(z)} \right| &\leq \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} \left(\left| \frac{z^2 f'_i(z)}{(f_i(z))^2} \right| M + 1 \right) \\ &\leq \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} \left(\left| \frac{z^2 f'_i(z)}{(f_i(z))^2} - 1 \right| M + M + 1 \right) \\ &\leq \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} (\mu_i M + M + 1) \\ &= \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{(1 + \mu_i)M + 1}{|\alpha_i|}. \end{aligned} \quad (2.22)$$

We have

$$\begin{aligned} \left| c|z|^{2\beta} + (1 - |z|^{2\beta}) \frac{zh''(z)}{\beta h'(z)} \right| &= \left| c|z|^{2\beta} + (1 - |z|^{2\beta}) \frac{1}{\beta} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{\alpha_i} \left(\frac{zf'_i(z)}{f_i(z)} - 1 \right) \right| \\ &\leq |c| + \frac{1}{|\beta|} \cdot \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{1}{|\alpha_i|} \left(\left| \frac{z^2 f'_i(z)}{f_i^2(z)} \right| \cdot \frac{|f_i(z)|}{|z|} + 1 \right). \end{aligned} \quad (2.23)$$

We obtain

$$\begin{aligned} \left| c|z|^{2\beta} + (1 - |z|^{2\beta}) \frac{zh''(z)}{\beta h'(z)} \right| &\leq |c| + \frac{1}{|\beta|} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{(1 + \mu_i)M + 1}{|\alpha_i|} \\ &\leq |c| + \frac{1}{\mathbf{Re} \beta} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{(1 + \mu_i)M + 1}{|\alpha_i|}. \end{aligned} \quad (2.24)$$

So, from (2.17) we have

$$\left| c|z|^{2\beta} + (1 - |z|^{2\beta}) \frac{zh''(z)}{\beta h'(z)} \right| \leq 1. \quad (2.25)$$

Applying Theorem 1.2, we obtain that $F_{\alpha_1, \alpha_2, \dots, \alpha_n, \beta}$ is univalent. \square

Corollary 2.7. Let $M \geq 1$, let the functions $f_i \in \mathcal{T}_{2, \mu_i}$, for $i \in \{1, \dots, n\}$, satisfy the condition (1.4), let α, β be complex numbers, let $\mathbf{Re} \beta \geq n((1 + \mu_i)M + 1)/|\alpha|$, and let c be a complex number.

If

$$\begin{aligned} |c| &\leq 1 - \frac{1}{\mathbf{Re} \beta} \frac{n((1 + \mu_i)M + 1)}{|\alpha|}, \\ |f_i(z)| &\leq M \end{aligned} \quad (2.26)$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the function

$$F_{\alpha, \beta}(z) = \left\{ \beta \int_0^z t^{\beta-1} \prod_{i=1}^n \left(\frac{f_i(t)}{t} \right)^{1/\alpha} dt \right\}^{1/\beta} \quad (2.27)$$

is in the class \mathcal{S} .

Proof. In Theorem 2.6, we consider $\alpha_1 = \alpha_2 = \dots = \alpha_n = \alpha$. \square

Corollary 2.8. Let the functions $f_i \in \mathcal{T}_{2, \mu_i}$, for $i \in \{1, \dots, n\}$, satisfy the condition (1.4), let α_i, β be complex numbers, let $\mathbf{Re} \beta \geq \sum_{i=1}^n ((\mu_i + 2)/|\alpha_i|)$, and let c be a complex number.

If

$$\begin{aligned} |c| &\leq 1 - \frac{1}{\mathbf{Re} \beta} \sum_{i=1}^n \frac{\mu_i + 2}{|\alpha_i|}, \\ |f_i(z)| &\leq 1 \end{aligned} \quad (2.28)$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the function $F_{\alpha_1, \alpha_2, \dots, \alpha_n, \beta}$ defined in (1.11) is in the class \mathcal{S} .

Proof. In Theorem 2.6, we consider $M = 1$. □

Corollary 2.9. Let $M \geq 1$, let the function $f \in \mathcal{T}_{2,\mu}$ satisfy the condition (1.4), let α, β be complex numbers, let $\operatorname{Re} \beta \geq ((1 + \mu)M + 1)/|\alpha|$, and let c be a complex number.

If

$$|c| \leq 1 - \frac{1}{\operatorname{Re} \beta} \frac{(1 + \mu)M + 1}{|\alpha|}, \quad (2.29)$$

$$|f(z)| \leq M$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the function

$$G_{\alpha,\beta}(z) = \left\{ \beta \int_0^z t^{\beta-1} \left(\frac{f(t)}{t} \right)^{1/\alpha} dt \right\}^{1/\beta} \quad (2.30)$$

is in the class \mathcal{S} .

Proof. In Theorem 2.6, we consider $n = 1$. □

Corollary 2.10. Let the function $f \in \mathcal{T}_{2,\mu}$ satisfy the condition (1.4), let α, β be complex numbers, let $\operatorname{Re} \beta \geq (\mu + 2)/|\alpha|$, and let c be a complex number.

If

$$|c| \leq 1 - \frac{1}{\operatorname{Re} \beta} \frac{\mu + 2}{|\alpha|}, \quad (2.31)$$

$$|f(z)| \leq 1$$

for all $z \in \mathcal{U}$, then the function

$$G_{\alpha,\beta}(z) = \left\{ \beta \int_0^z t^{\beta-1} \left(\frac{f(t)}{t} \right)^{1/\alpha} dt \right\}^{1/\beta} \quad (2.32)$$

is in the class \mathcal{S} .

Proof. In Corollary 2.9, we consider $M = 1$. □

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
